

Did you know what types of items the Woodvale Community League has provided in your area or has done to help others in Edmonton. Support your community and buy a membership!

This is just a partial list of how the Woodvale Community League supports the community.

- Built the Activity Centre in the late 1980s (next to Greenview Park skating rink) and provides FREE USAGE to non-profit groups; there has been a playschool operating from the facility for almost the entire time since this was built, along with other groups such as Jr. Forest Wardens, Yoga classes, Brownies, Youth Groups etc.
- In 2000, had all the trees and shrubs planted on the boulevards along 38 Ave from 50 St to 66 St; as well trees were planted along the boulevard of Hillview Park on Woodvale Road East and additional trees in both Hillview and Greenview Parks. Also added additional walkways to complete walking trails.
- Had the basketball courts built in Hillview and Greenview parks.
- Built the Greenview Park Skating Rink.
- Contributed to reshaling the baseball diamonds in Woodvale.
- Provided some of the funding to assist MCARFA in getting the Jackie Parker Spray Park built.
- Provided \$150,000 to rebuild each of the 3 playgrounds in Woodvale (in Hillview Park, in Greenview Park and on John Paul 1 School grounds) for a total of \$450,000. Hillview Park playground was rebuilt in 2014, John Paul 1 playground was rebuilt in 2015 and the playground in Greenview Park is currently being rebuilt but will not reopen until the latter part of the summer in 2017. A playground generally costs in the \$400,000 to \$600,000 range.
- Contributes funds towards the Canada Day Celebrations held in Mill Woods Park on July 1.
- Have been donating \$5,000 in matching grant funds yearly to each of the 3 schools in Woodvale: Greenview, Hillview and John Paul 1 schools. This has contributed to purchasing such things as white boards, lap tops, items for their music programs and athletic programs for keeping children fit, etc.
- Have donated to the Mill Woods Seniors Activity Centre new facility built on Hewes Way and towards a new photocopier for the centre.
- \$5,000 is donated each year to 10 local charities (\$500 each).
- Subsidizes an annual Ski Night at the Strathcona Science Park (next night is Feb 25, 2017 with tickets only \$15 per person with helmets and skis included).
- Subsidizes an annual golf tournament at Mill Wood's Golf Course for Woodvale Community League members.
- Have put on yearly Community League Day celebrations (3rd Saturday in September).
